**For this first Tech Talk on July 23<sup>rd</sup>, Derek Slocum, the Town Engineer for Harrisburg, NC will give a short presentation on Harrisburg's development of a stormwater master plan.**

*"After establishing the fee, it became clear that due to legacy issues (flooding, aging infrastructure, erosion, etc.), our needs exceeded resources/revenue. As a result the Town decided to develop a stormwater master plan containing a 5-10 year CIP to allocate revenue.*

*In early 2011, the Town began its master planning process—major goals included:*

- *Streamlined and cost-effective (i.e., the Town wanted to limit the money and time spent on planning and studies).*
- *Implementation (i.e., the plan identifies constructed projects that directly improve quality of life in Harrisburg).*
- *Citizen and stakeholder driven (i.e., sell and brand the stormwater program and leverage the knowledge of residents to better pinpoint issues).*
- *Understanding previous work and staff knowledge (no need to reinvent the wheel).*
- *Complimentary of the Town's MS4/NPDES Permit (i.e., spend dollars that satisfies both the needs of the community and the requirements of the regulatory agencies).*
- *Partnership (NCDOT, FEMA, NCDENR, etc.) and funding (CWMTF grants, etc.) focused.*

*The Master Plan and CIP was completed at the end of 2011 and multiple projects have been implemented over the last few years."*
